MAINTENANCE

The Tuggeranong Dog Training Club is operated by volunteers. Therefore, all fees paid by members go towards the operation of the club. These fees have been used to pay for normal expenses such as water, ground maintenance, electricity etc. However, in recent times, the club has enjoyed a boom in membership which hopefully reflects on the training provided by instructors. Also, extra funds have become available for much needed club projects. How have those extra funds been used? Lighting

Members will have noted that the car park is now well lit and that the oval lighting is much more effective. Nine of our stadium lights have been upgraded to LED. Apart from better lighting, the new lights draw only 300 watts (approx) each as against the old 1000 Watt bulbs. The light in the

top corner as also been fixed. For the record, the upgrade cost approximately \$10,000.

Sprinkler System

The sprinkler system has been in the ground for nearly 20 years and the system was in need of a major check out. Sprinklers have been adjusted to address deficient spray patterns. The large container was lifted to allow repair work on one sprinkler line to take place. The sprinkler control box has also been replaced.

General Maintenance

The cold weather caused a water valve in the ceiling of the club to leak creating a nice little waterfall from the manhole. All is now well. **Bob**

Agility is a fast paced dog sport, with the main aim being to work through a sequence of obstacles together at speed. Agility enhances your relationship with your dog, and also helps both yours, and your dog's fitness. Dogs of most breeds and sizes can participate in agility. They all enjoy blasting through tunnels, making their way over jumps, and clambering up the A-frame. Dogs do need to be 14 months or over to start training in agility. This is to ensure their bones and joints have fully developed. Agility is an exciting, energetic, fun dog sport, allowing dogs to exercise their

Pup Treats - From 'Pet Cookbook' by Kim McCosker

- * 2 cups rolled oats
- * 2 ripe bananas, mashed
- * 1/4 cup natural peanut butter
- * 1/4 cup coconut oil

Preheat oven to 180 ℃.

Line a tray with baking paper.

In a large bowl, combine oats, bananas, peanut butter and coconut oil.

Add an additional 2 tablespoons oats, or until the dough is no longer sticky.

Working on a lightly floured surface, knead the dough 3 to 4 times until it comes together.

Using a rolling pin, roll the dough 1cm thick.

Then with cookie cutters, cut the desired shapes and place onto the prepared tray. Bake until the edges are golden brown, about 12 to 15 minutes.

Cool completely.

PEANUT BUTTER: Is a favourite for many dogs. Not only is it a good source of protein but it also contains heart healthy fats and vitamins. Choose natural peanut butter for your dogs (and your children!) and preferably, one without added sugars and other additives. Similarly, bananas are a great treat and very few dogs are allergic to them. In fact, nearly all dogs can enjoy bananas especially performance or working dogs because they contain natural sugars which metabolize quickly providing instant energy.
